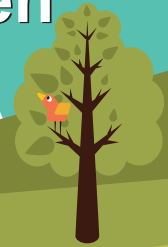

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Getting Started

Entering kindergarten is an important step in every child's development. A successful transition into school for children who need support involves parents and professionals working together to plan and make decisions.

The Kindergarten Planning Meeting is an opportunity for you, School District staff and other professionals, who work with your child, to plan your child's entry into kindergarten. Kindergarten Planning meetings occur on designated dates in early spring (*around March of each year*).

The process begins when you complete the school district's Kindergarten Planning Consent Form and return it to the Children's Therapy and Family Resource Center. This form alerts the school district that your child may require special consideration for kindergarten entry. It also allows professionals to share information about your child in preparation for the Kindergarten Planning meeting.

Preparing For Your Meeting

You may want to prepare an information package about your child to share with School District staff.

This could include:

- Your child's strengths
- Strategies that have worked in the past (*at home or in child-care settings*)
- Copies of reports and progress notes from professionals
- Pictures showing your child doing typical activities

These are only a few suggestions. Use your imagination when creating this "snapshot" of your child.

School Registration

Please note that you must register your child at your local elementary school even if you have completed and returned the Kindergarten Planning Consent Form.

You will need to bring:

- Proof of address
- Your child's birth certificate
- BC Services Card
- Any legal documentation concerning custody

It will be helpful to specify what support needs your child has and that you have requested a Kindergarten Planning meeting.

Working with the School District

What does the School District want to know when you meet with them?

At the planning meeting, discussion will focus on five basic questions:

- Do you feel that your child is ready to attend school?
- What concerns do you have about your child's school entry?
- What difficulties or support needs should the school be aware of?
- Is there a medical condition/ diagnosis that may help the school better?
- Is there any documentation (*medical or other formal assessments*) of your child's support needs?

Documentation is required by the Ministry of Education for your child to access additional supports.
